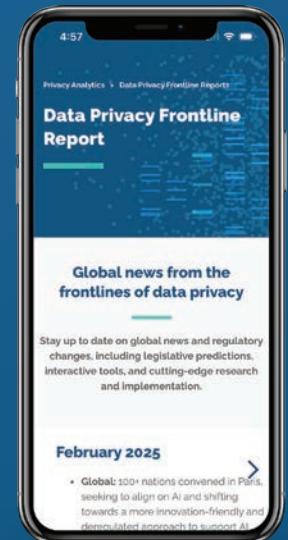

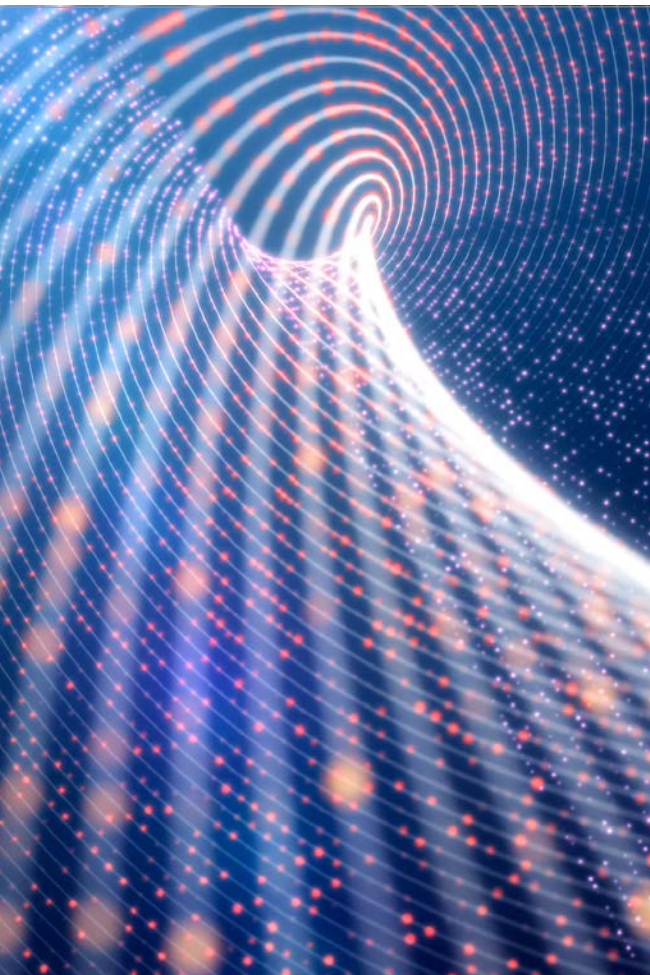

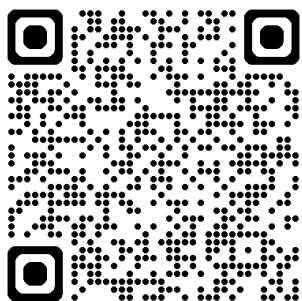

Excellent privacy training is tangible evidence of the strength of a privacy program.



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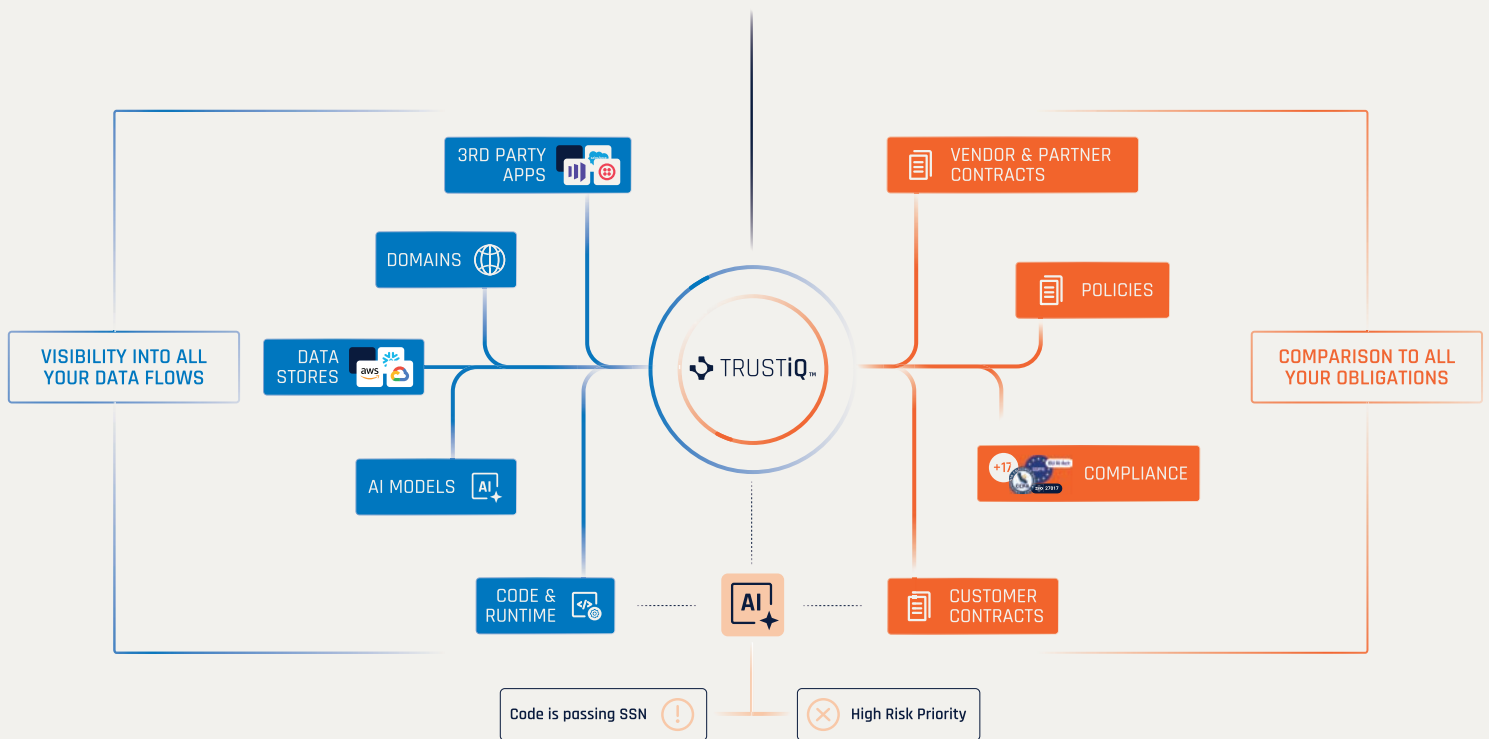
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
